PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Student Illness at school

We are seeing a large number of students attending school whilst ill. In particular, a number of students returning to school a day after gastroenteritis type symptoms.



The Public Health and Wellbeing Regulations 2019, Schedule 7

states –*'for Diarrhoeal illness – in an outbreak of gastroenteritis, exclude until there has not been vomiting or a loose bowel motion for 48 hours, and for all other diarrhoeal illnesses exclude until there has not been vomiting or a loose bowel motion for 24 hours'*.

We ask parents to please keep unwell students at home.

We want our parents/caregivers/guardians to tell us what they think!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. The survey is optional but we encourage all families to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All families are invited to participate in the survey. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey will be open from next **Monday 7 August to Friday 8 September 2023.**

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

The invitation to the survey, including the link and pin code required will be on our Compass App next Monday August 7. Please speak to your child's teacher if you would like more information.

Uniform

Following on from a recent decision to include black shorts, the rain jacket and bucket hat to the schools uniform, we thought it would be timely to share the uniform list.

- Dress /culottes in "545" material
- Grey pinafore / Plain grey tights
- Grey school shorts
- Black school shorts
- Plain black track pants
- '545' polo shirt (short or long sleeve)
- '545' polar fleece jacket
- '545' rain jacket
- Plain white or grey socks (no logos). Ankle socks are not acceptable.
- Black shoes or predominantly plain black runners.
- '545' hat – bucket or broad brimmed (compulsory Sept - April)
- Red '545' beanie (optional in Winter)

If you would like a copy of the complete policy, it can be accessed on the school's website or available from the office.

Late Arrivals and Early Departures from School

Parents and carers need to be aware that students who arrive late to school **must come via the office, accompanied by a parent/carer, to have their entry recorded into the Compass Kiosk. They will receive a late slip to hand to their teacher and to have their arrival at school recorded.**

Similarly parents/carers must sign their child/ren out at the school office on the Compass Kiosk if they need to pick their child/ren up early from school.

If children are returned to school, parents are to accompany their child/ren to the office and have their arrival recorded at the school office via the Compass App or by office staff.

Class Dojo

Class dojo is no longer operational. All communication with classroom teachers will now occur through Compass. If you are yet to download the app, please do so as soon as possible, as this Newline and all further school communication, school interview bookings, absence notifications etc, will be done via the Compass App.

Coming up in Week 7 is the Children's Book Council of Australia - Book Week celebration. Our annual dress-up day will be held on **Tuesday, August 22.**

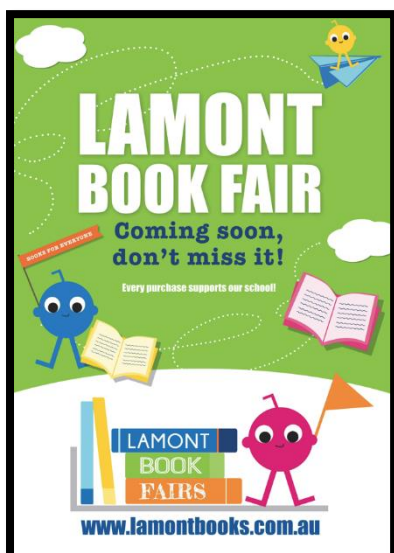
