Book Week

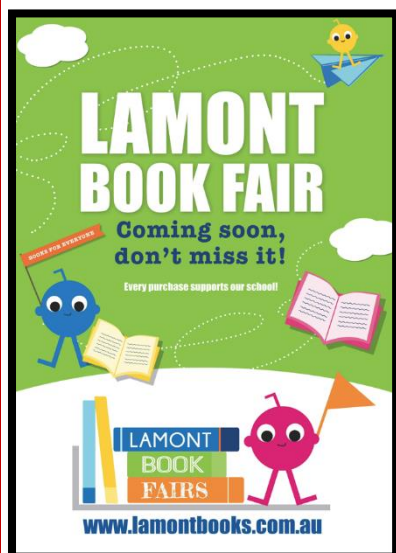
Coming up in Week 7 is the Children's Book Council of Australia - Book Week celebration. Our annual dress-up day will be held on **Thursday August 24.**

On Wednesday of last week, some of our senior students attended a Student Leadership Conference at Wurruk Primary School. This day followed on from the first session that was held at Gippsland Grammar St Anne's Campus last term. Different students from primary schools in the area got together and discussed what collaborative and autocratic leadership is, the pros and cons of both and how to get the most out of the people you are leading. '545' was well represented and, after debriefing with the students at the end of the day, they all said they had a great day and enjoyed the opportunity to create new friendships and build on existing ones. Everyone involved is looking forward to the next session in Term 4!



Kidsville

Since the start of the term, all of the senior classes have taken part in the Inquiry topic of Kidsville. The fictional Shire of Flooding Creek saw the creation of Mount Piddington, Robbinshood, Luville, Breezville, Gleson Bay and Watts Bay. All of the students involved took on a job and/or important role within the town, paired with a new name, shop, house design, town design, annual salary and weekly budget. It has been weeks in the making and the students have enjoyed creating their character profiles, researching what their shop fronts could look like and working out the area and perimeter of their homes and workplaces, some living a little more extravagantly than their salary allows! They have taken on a new appreciation for weekly expenses, such as food shopping, fuel and reporting on events in the town and the effort that goes into gathering information and quotes.



This past week the students have dressed up as their character each day, and have enjoyed arresting their friends, pretending to bake cakes, nurse people back to health or the aged pensioners having trouble walking between classes with their walking sticks.

Unfortunately, on Thursday night there was a natural disaster in the form of an avalanche from Mount Piddington that wreaked havoc across the whole Flooding Creek Shire! Mount Piddington and Robbinshood were completely destroyed with major flooding and the destruction and pollution of waterways in Luville, Breezville, Gleson Bay and Watts Bay. Friday saw students reporting on the destruction and all of the communities banded together to help with the clean up,

demonstrating the importance of community spirit and support.

On Monday afternoon, we had a celebration for all of the hard work the students and staff have put into another successful unit of Kidsville.

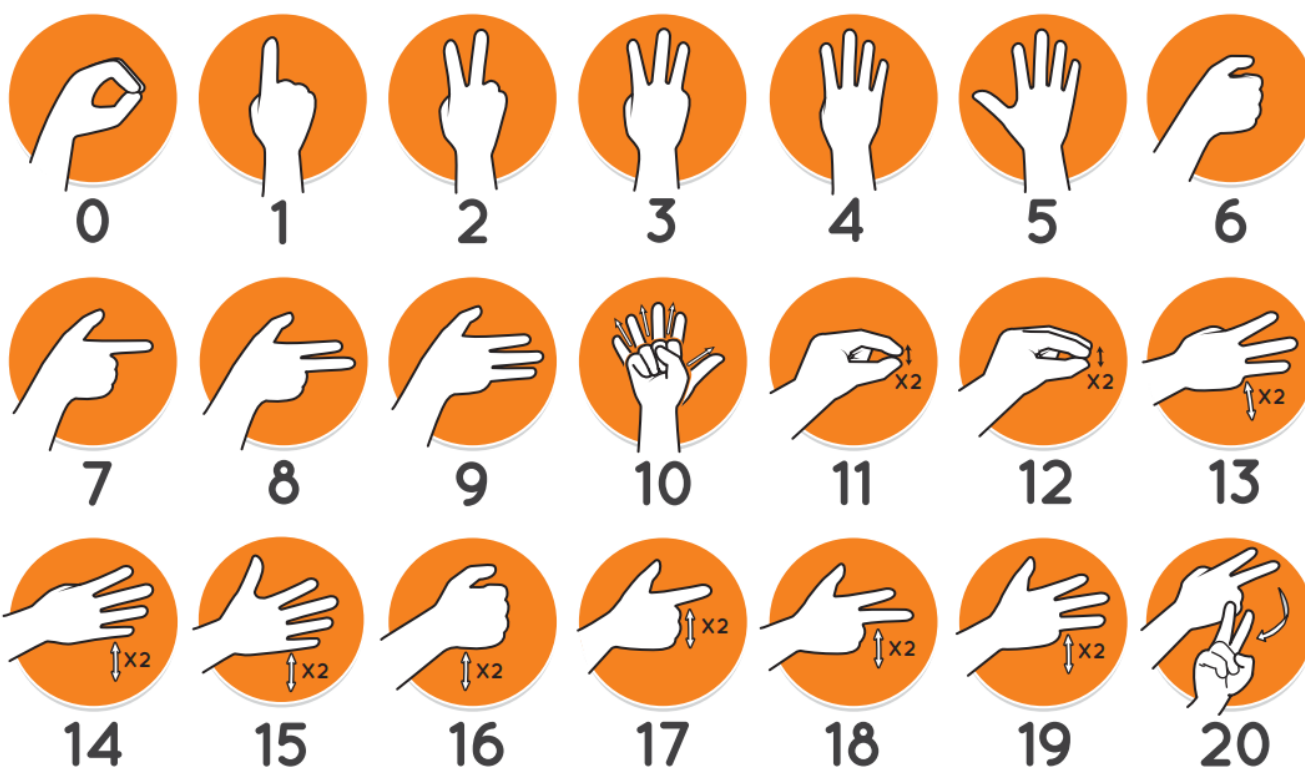

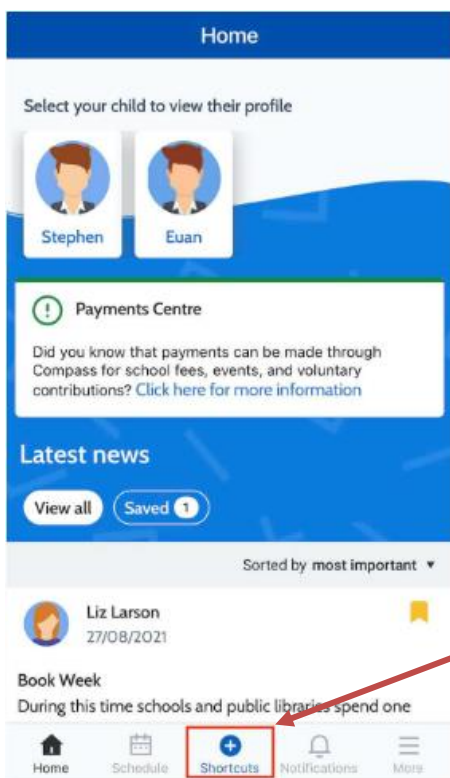

Get started with Compass



Compass is a web-based system, which allows you to access up-to-date and meaningful information about our school and your child's progress.

545 Paper Aeroplane STEM Challenge

- **The Challenge: Build a paper aeroplane that flies as far as possible!**
 - Collect materials:
 - Paper – regular boring copy paper is usually the best, but experiment with any kind of paper
 - Tape/paperclips/straws
 - Measuring tape
 - Read the Science background for paper aeroplanes
 - What are your ideas to build a paper aeroplane
 - You can Use the paper designs to help you and draw them
 - Select a design that you think will fly the greatest distance.
 - Build your aeroplanes
 - Remember that folding paper aeroplanes can be tricky. Go slow and make sure you line up edges carefully!
 - TEST:
 - Set up your measuring tape (Outside if you can!)
 - Throw your planes Observe flight – Does it fly straight? Does it curve up or down? Does it spin? Write it down on your chart.
 - Make a change! (refold, flatten, bend a wing, add a paperclip, fix a crease, change how you throw, etc.)
 - REPEAT – Continue to improve your aeroplane to maximize your distance.
- Work on this for at least 20 minutes! If you want to, fold another plane!

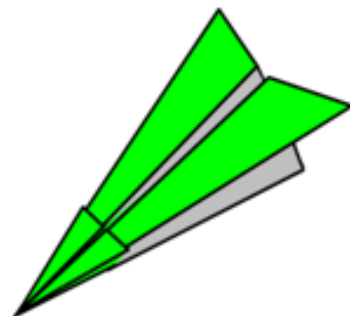

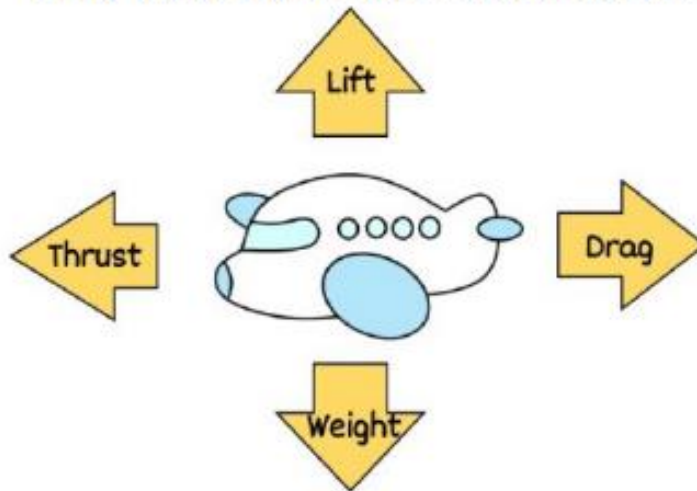


SCIENCE BACKGROUND

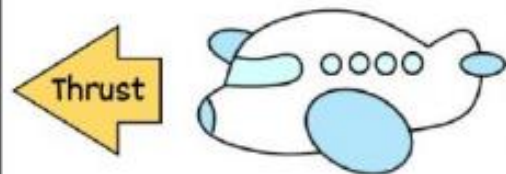
Paper Aeroplane

The four forces of flight:

Lift, drag, weight and thrust are the forces acting on an aeroplane. To maintain a steady flight requires balance of the four forces.



Thrust is the force that moves a flying machine in the direction of motion. It is created with a propeller, jet engine or rocket. Paper Aeroplanes get thrust from the person throwing it therefore to increase thrust, you'll need to throw harder!



Drag is the force that acts opposite to the direction of motion. It tends to slow down an object. Drag is caused by friction or differences in air pressure. The front of an aeroplane is narrow to create less drag. The shape of aeroplanes are designed in such a manner that they move easily through the air.
