## ART ROOM NEWS LOU COOPER



Last week Foundation students finished their two week unit on stamping and mark making. The first week they used a variety of tools such as milk bottle tops, corks, cotton tips, sponges and stamps to make different patterns and marks using the three primary paint colours. The following week they chose from either a butterfly or dragonfly and carefully traced the wings and bodies, cut them out and stuck them on either red, yellow or blue backing. They are on display on the board in the main building if you wanted to check them out.
Senior students have been busy creating their mixed media self portraits. First they drew a picture of themselves then cut it in quarters. On one quarter they used pastels, another quarter watercolour paint, the third quarter black and white only using texta, pastel and/ or charcoal and the last quarter 3D using buttons, sequins, patty pans. Collage pieces, beads etc.
