# ART ROOM NEWS LOU COOPER

The Middle students have finished their two week unit on Grotti Lotti inspired birds (check out her artwork if you are not familiar with it, it's amazing!). We looked at, and discussed, all the different and intricate lines and marks she paints on her birds. Students used watered down acrylic paints to create their head, beak and body of their chosen Australian birds and recreated the "drips" similar to Grotti Lotti's birds.

The following week students added in detail to make their birds come alive, using Posca pens, fineliners and markers.

Senior students also finished their two week unit on Australian Mulga the artist. They chose what fruit or vegetable cartoon character they wanted to draw, adding the Mulga character features such as sunglasses and moustache. Seniors coloured their characters using markers and Posca pens, cut them out, then stuck them on a coloured card and created a patterned background.

They have all done an absolutely fabulous job.
