

# ART ROOM NEWS LOU COOPER

Foundation students finished their two week unit on Paul Klee's "Senecio" or commonly known as "Head of a Man". We discussed what an abstract portrait looks like, different shapes we could see in the artwork, the colour wheel, warm and cool colours and also that colours can express feelings and emotion. Students then completed a guided drawing (using a paper plate to trace for the head), and used different mediums such as

watercolour, chalk and oil pastels to colour their Head of a Man, in either warm or cool colours. I absolutely adore these and the students loved this unit.

Middles finished off their Great Barrier Reef inspired art pieces. We looked at Ken Done's "Big Jewel Reef" and Melanie Hava's "A Reef Wonderland". As a class we compared the two artworks, discussing similarities and differences between the 2 pieces. Students then made tints of blue (with graduations from white circle for the light) to create their sea. They then drew a variety of reef sea creatures, cut them out and stuck them on their pieces. Using paint slicks, Middles then painted their coral reefs and used Posca pens for their coral plants. Fabulous job Middles.
