Sale & District Swimming Carnival





FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR FAMILIES CSEF (CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND)

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF (camps, sports and excursions fund). The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual amount per student is \$150 for primary school students and \$250 for secondary school students.

If you received CSEF at our school last year, you do not need to reapply unless there has been a change to your family circumstances.

Please complete an application form if you are a:

- * new enrolment (your child has started or changed schools), or
- * you have *changed family circumstances* (such as change of custody, change of name, change of concession number or new siblings starting this year.

If you have any queries, please contact the school office for clarification and/or application form.

TOUR SIGNATURE David Hall

In just over two and a half weeks, I will embark on my 4th Tour De Cure Ride to Cure Cancer. We will be leaving Hobart on the 14th of March and heading to Adelaide. 1400 km over 9 days and just over 14km of vertical climbing. It is going to be a tough ride. Over the last 3 months I have been getting up at 5am, four days a week so that I can get the km's on my legs that I need. I have been averaging around 300km every week and have been blessed this year to have my son Jake, hop on a bike and be my training partner. Even after a serious accident a few weeks back, he still gets up and rides with me.

There would not be many people who have not been impacted by cancer in one way or another. They have either had it or know someone who has and that is something that we are trying to change.

My own personal journey with cancer began in 2007 when I was diagnosed with stage 4 bowel cancer and given slim odds of surviving beyond 5 years. Here I am, 16 years later and still going strong. I lost my father in 2017 to brain cancer after a short and brutal battle. Cancer doesn't discriminate because of gender, age, standing in the community, rich or poor or for any other reason. I am raising money to suport the reseachers, so that they can find the cures or treatments required to make cancer a thing of the past.

We have a long way to go and as part of my committment I have to raise a minimum of \$12,000. I have currently surpassed that and am nearly at \$13,000 through the support of friends, family and communites that have been touched by cancer. Over my previous 3 tours I have raised in excess of \$36,000.

During my previous rides I have met some amazing people and even had the chance to ride around the Sale RAAF Base airstrip in 2017.







FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
