ANZAC Day Ceremony

This **Friday April 21 at 2:00pm** all staff and students will attend our annual Anzac Day Service. We will welcome **RAAF Defence Force Member Squadron Leader Vice-Wing Commander Jason Page** as our special guest to this event.

Our Junior School Council and School Choir will assist me in the running of the Ceremony and we extend an invitation to all parents and friends to also join us for this very special and respectful event.

As part of the Ceremony, all students will have the opportunity to lay flowers / wreaths at the Cenotaph situated in the front yard of the school. **As such, all students are encouraged to bring flower arrangements on Friday.**

At the completion of the Ceremony we will also have a special planting of a Lone Pine seedling adjacent to the Cenotaph. The Hatwell Family have kindly donated this seedling to the school as a replacement to the large Lilly Pilly that was destroyed last year. The Lone Pine seedling was sourced from the Australian War Memorial in Canberra and is a descendant of the Lone Pine species found on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

The school will also be represented at the Wellington Shire Dawn Service in Sale on Tuesday April 25 by a student group (and Mrs Wilson) currently completing a Rotary Community Service Award.

Wellington Division Tennis

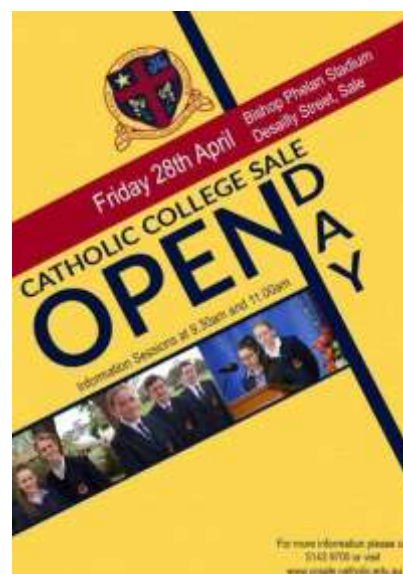
