## Science Week – Sustainability

Our whole-school cross-age activities day on Friday was a great success. Students participated in three activities in the morning:

- an environmental art

activity

- watching War on Waste and writing letters to the Premier about banning plastic bags
- participating in a rubbish sorting activity to become more knowledgeable about how things can be recycled and learning about the 4 Rs: Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

A rubbish-free picnic lunch for families followed and it was fantastic to see so many families with picnic rugs sharing lunch with their children. Almost everyone had a rubbish-free lunch and we hope this will show everyone that it is possible to bring food to school without wrappings. People with rubbish-free lunches received a ticket in the raffle with approximately 40 prizes such as drink bottles, T-shirts, reusable shopping bags, etc given away.

In the afternoon our annual rubbish audit was conducted across the school to track how we are going in terms of reducing and correctly sorting our rubbish and in order to plan for how to better do this in the future. The results show that we are still producing a lot of rubbish – particularly in packaging such as chip packets and plastic wrap. Students were shocked at how much food is being thrown away including untouched fruit and sandwiches, but this did show some improvement from last year. Hopefully after our picnic lunch there will be great improvements in this area.
