Information Nights

In 2018, Sale Primary School aims to engage further with our parent community. We want to increase communication and develop a mutual understanding around how we can work together as a team to give our students an optimum learning experience.

As part of this initiative, all sub-schools will be conducting **Information Nights** as follows:

- **Next Monday February 26: Middle School (Grades 3 & 4)**
- **Next Tuesday February 27: Senior School (Grades 5 & 6)**
- **Wednesday February 28: Junior School (Grades 1 & 2)**
- **Wednesday March 7: Foundation (Preps)**

These nights will have a consistent pattern as follows:

- **7:00-7:30:** Parents to attend brief Information Session together hearing from the Principal, Specialist Teacher representative and the classroom teachers with the focus being primarily around: 'what happens each week' and 'how parents can assist their child's learning at home'! These presentations will begin in the Rainbow Room (building adjacent to Cunningham Street) and finish in the respective classrooms of each sub-school
- **7:30 – 8:00:** Parents to break off into grade groups and visit their child's classroom with their teacher for a tour and Q & A session.
- **Please Note:** As required, staff will be available to supervise children between **7:00**

Supervision: Children are supervised between the hours of 8.45am and 3.45pm.

- **8:00** in support of parents who will be otherwise engaged.

Parent-Teacher Interviews

To further enhance our communication with and engagement of parents, the school will also be conducting Parent-Teacher Interviews on **Monday March 19**. These interviews will be supported by an Interim Report that identifies each student’s Social Relationships and Work Habits and their Attendance Data for Term 1. **Normal programs will not run on this day**, students will only be expected to attend these Parent-Teacher Interviews with their parents. Online booking information for these interviews will be sent out shortly.


Parents & Friends Meeting
