**This week's Weekly Award Winners**

## Sustainability – Di Collins

Last Friday Lana from Conservation Volunteers Australia came to 545. She took our Garden Guerrillas on an excursion to the Sale Wetlands to look for different plants - indigenous and weeds - rubbish and birds.

Students learned that our Wetlands are internationally recognised, as they are very important. As well as being the home of many native birds, fish and animals, they are home for a period each year for certain migratory birds which fly all the way here from places such as Canada, Siberia and Japan. These birds ONLY come to the Sale Wetlands, so it is a very important place and we discussed how we need to look after it by keeping it healthy.

Ways that we can all help are by making sure we don't drop rubbish ourselves and by picking up any rubbish we see, so it doesn't end up getting washed into the Wetlands. Another important factor is ensuring that we are careful not to spread weeds. One weed which is a big problem in our Wetlands is a plant called the Fishbone which spreads all over the top of the surface of the water. It can trap fish and birds and stops sunlight shining on the water. This is actually a plant that you can buy in pet shops to put in fish tanks. The problem is that when fish die, many people tip the water (and plants) down the drain or onto the garden where it gets washed into the Wetlands.

Lana also did a presentation on the same topic for the Middle School and they did a variety of activities to deepen their knowledge of our important Wetlands.

### BANANA PANCAKES

#### INGREDIENTS

- 2 large bananas
- 1 1/2 cups wholemeal self-raising flour
- 1 1/2 cups buttermilk
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 tablespoon honey
- Olive oil cooking spray
- Honey and reduced-fat passionfruit yoghurt, to serve

#### METHOD

##### Step 1

Mash 1 banana in a bowl (see note). Place flour in a bowl. Make a well in the centre. Combine buttermilk, eggs, honey and mashed banana in a jug. Pour into well. Whisk until smooth. Stand for 10 minutes.

##### Step 2

Spray a large, non-stick frying pan with oil. Heat over medium heat. Spoon 1/4 cup batter into pan. Cook for 2 to 3 minutes or until bubbles appear on the surface. Turn. Cook for 1 to 2 minutes or until golden and cooked through. Transfer to a plate. Cover to keep warm. Repeat with remaining batter to make 12 pancakes.

##### Step 3

Thinly slice remaining banana. Place pancakes on plates. Top with sliced banana, honey and yoghurt. Serve.
