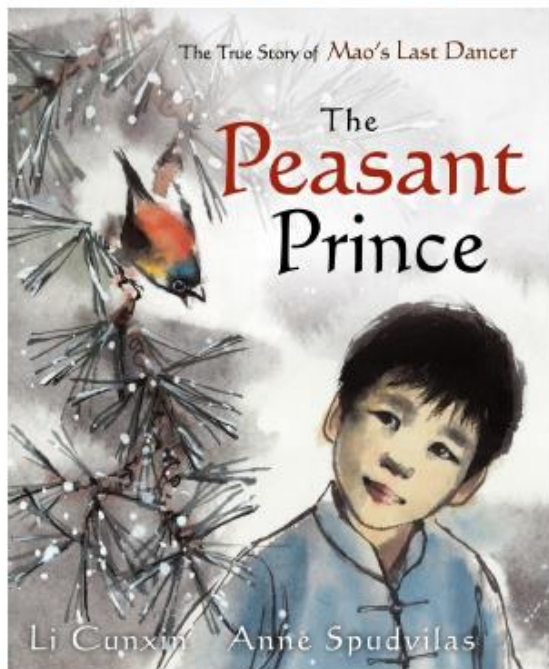
Title: The Peasant Prince

Author: Li Cunxin

Synopsis: This beautifully illustrated picture story book begins in Northern China. It tells the true story of a boy from a very poor family, who through hard work, determination and perseverance becomes one of the premier and most sought after ballet dancers in the world. Sound familiar? You may have heard about the award winning memoir and later movie Mao's Last Dancer? This is the picture story book version that can be cherished by all ages.

The Peasant Prince reads like a fairy tale, perhaps mirroring the type of story Li would tell through dance on stage. This would be enjoyed utmost by those who like ballet, enjoy stunning illustrations or perhaps just need some inspiration.



Fun facts about the Author: - Li Cunxin has been the Artistic Director of the Queensland Ballet since 2012. Before joining the Queensland Ballet, Li was an established stockbroker.

- In 2014, Li was Queensland's nomination for Australian of the Year.

Fun facts about the Illustrator: - Anne Spudvilas is nominated in the Children's Book Council of Australia awards this year in the "Picture Book of the Year" category for her latest masterpiece Swan Lake. She won this category back in 2000 with Margaret Wild for Jenny Angel.

- Was a Archibald Prize finalist in 2000.

- Spudvilas has worked in the past as a courtroom artist for the Melbourne media.

Library Captains' Excursion

Last week, 545's Library captains: Ella, Eloise and Kira went on an excursion to Collins Booksellers and the new Sale Library with Miss Ross and Linda Wilson.

First we went to Collins Booksellers in Raymond Street. There, we learnt that they sell on average 100 books per day and about 35,000 a year. The shop was opened by the previous owners and it was originally located in the Gippsland Centre for 10 years. It has been on Raymond Street for over 25 years now.

Next we went to the Sale Library located at the Port of Sale. We learnt that 17% of the Wellington Shire are members of the library service. Our tour guide, Kath, also taught us how to use the search touch screens as well as what collections are located where. The Sale Library has many different collections including children's books, board books, DVDs, non-fiction and the Gippsland Times archives.

Overall, we really liked learning new facts about the Sale Library and Collins Booksellers. We would like to thank Miss Ross for organising the afternoon and Linda for coming with us.

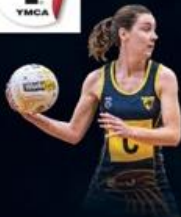
