#### Principal's Report – Chris Malone

##### Road safety

This week we have unfortunately had a few near misses and concerns

reported to the office involving students and parents. Please speak to your child in regards to road safety, and in particular being aware of cars when crossing the road.

The use of mobile phones whilst in control of a motor vehicle is illegal and carries a fine from local Police. Unfortunately for some parents, this is not enough of a deterrent. Please consider other road users when you think of answering a call or texting someone when you are in control of your car. This week we have had a report of a near miss and others have been sighted using their phones whilst reversing or driving near the school. No-one wants a child or adult to be run over due to a call or text that could surely wait a few minutes.

##### Splitting classes

There has recently been a few questions asked about this so I will attempt to address any concerns. Sale Primary School is a very traditional and proud school. The splitting of classes is not something that is new in Education and some schools have been doing it for a very

long time, but Sale PS have not. In an effort to save some money at Sale PS (approximately \$400 per day), occasionally staff absences will not be covered and classes will be split appropriately instead. **This will be done on a case by case basis.**

The staff have been consulted in regards to this and plans should now be in place in each team level which ensure the students are sent to the same class (if their teacher is away). Our PLC (Professional Learning Community) approach, where staff plan together and then share the minutes across the school, should assist this process.

In summary:

**Foundation Team:** It was agreed that they would never be split due to the students' age.

**Junior Team:** These classes will be split among the Team. They currently have 5 classes of 21 students each.

**Middle Team:** These classes to be split from P-4. They currently have classes of 22.

**Senior Team:** These classes to be split across the whole school. They currently have classes of 28.

**Specialist teachers:** They will always be covered as they also create time release for Teaching staff.

##### NOTE:

When a staff member is going to be away for more than one day, a CRT will be used.

A maximum of one class will be split per day (to be decided by the Principal)

An effort will be made not to impact the same class too many times throughout the year.

If you have any concerns, please contact me.

School Supervision: Children are supervised between the hours of 8.45am and 3.45pm.

I hope that you all enjoy a safe and happy school holiday period and that everyone is ready to return to school for **Term 2 on Monday, 16 April.**


#### *Vegie garden makeover*

#### ***New program saves 545 money and the environment water***

Last week it was noticed that the area near the gate was damp. Soon after, an email was received from Schools Water Efficiency Program (SWEP) which we had joined only a couple of weeks ago, notifying us that there was a spike in water use and we were losing a minimum of 300 litres per hour! Plumbers were immediately called and it was discovered that we did indeed have a major water leak.

The value of this program, which we came to through our participation in the ResourceSmart Schools Program, could not be more evident. We now receive real-time information about water use which will allow us to monitor our water use and plan ways to reduce it.
