Principal's Report

National Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute

to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The dates for NRW remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

The theme for 2019 is:

Grounded in Truth Walk Together with Courage

At the heart of reconciliation is the relationship between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. To foster positive race relations, our relationship must be grounded in a foundation of truth.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have long called for a comprehensive process of truth-telling about Australia's colonial history. Our nation's past is reflected in the present, and will continue to play out in future unless we heal historical wounds. Today, 80 per cent of Australians believe it is important to undertake formal truth telling processes, according to the 2018 Australian Reconciliation Barometer. Australians are ready to come to terms with our history as a crucial step towards a unified future, in which we understand, value and respect each other.

Whether you're engaging in challenging conversations or unlearning and relearning what you know, this journey requires all of us to walk together with courage. This National Reconciliation Week, we invite Australians from all backgrounds to contribute to our national movement towards a unified future.

This year 545 will be having a special morning to acknowledge this reconciliation (**Tuesday 28th May**). Our morning will begin with a whole school assembly at 9:00am, where we will have a welcome to country and acknowledgement of country. Students will then return to their classrooms to complete some work with an aboriginal theme. Throughout the morning they will be required to come out and place their thumb print on a mural that will be created and displayed at school with the support of local aboriginal artists. Students will have the opportunity to make woolen bracelets to keep as a memento at recess. We would like to see as many local community members come in on that morning as we can get.

Sunday Market Thanks

Last Sunday our school was given the opportunity to run the bbq at the Sale Charity Sunday Market. Our school received a cheque for \$1,500.00 which will go towards our Breakfast Club program. Thanks to our parents and staff who volunteered their time on Sunday. Thank you also to the Sunday Charity Market organisation for giving us the opportunity to fundraise for our school.


