School Review

The PRSE (Pre Review Self Evaluation) Report was submitted last week and the Reviewer, Barry Sorraghan, was very impressed with how it was written. The staff have spent countless

hours working on the contents of this as a team and should be commended. The Validation Day, which is the next step in the Review process, is Monday 4th June. On this day a number of external Department of Education & Training (DET employees) will be present at 545 as they begin their unpacking and understanding of our school. This will be followed up by two Fieldwork days, 21st and 22nd June, which are two days for the external DET employees to spend in classrooms observing, and also speaking to staff, students and interested parents. Further details for parents who wish to be involved will be available closer to the Fieldwork days. As a school staff we are anxiously looking forward to the recommendations that will come out of this in the report that we receive next term.

Planned Asbestos Removal Works Ewen Jondahl

The Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) will be undertaking the safe removal of asbestos-containing materials (ACM) from

Block C (library and toilet block) this Saturday May 26 and Sunday May 27, 2018.

The VSBA has engaged an expert occupational hygienist and asbestos removalist to undertake this work.

Works are scheduled to commence at approximately 8.00am each day. I can reassure you that we are working closely with the project managers to ensure that all work occurs outside of school hours when there is nobody on the school site.

All works, including the removal of ACM, will be undertaken in strict accordance with the Victorian Occupational Health and Safety framework and environmental regulations. The occupational hygienist will undertake air monitoring as part of this process, and they will issue a clearance certificate to indicate that the area is safe to go into after ACM removal.

Please be reassured that while Block C (library and toilet block) is currently safe to occupy, these works will ensure the ongoing safety of the school community.

I appreciate your cooperation and patience during this process. Please do not hesitate to contact me through the front office if you have any further questions, on 5144 5545.
