Be part of 545's History Commemorative Plaques

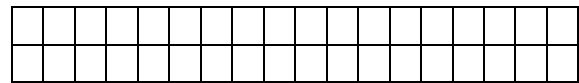
An opportunity exists again this year for former and existing members of our school community who would like to support the school and leave their mark on history.

SALE COLLEGE FORENSIC SCIENCE

On the 2nd of November 2018 Sale PS students from Year 6 did Forensic Science with some of the Sale college staff such as Mr K, Miss Cook and Mrs Crisp.

To begin with, the 545 students learnt about fingerprints and how no one can have the same print as you. Then the year 6 students got special ink and put their fingers on it softly and then placed their fingers on paper to see what fingerprints they had.

After that, the students discussed the differences of their fingerprints. Then they made a tally of the whole class's different fingerprints and the most common, which was loops.

To sum it up, the year six students put lipstick on and compared the differences between their lips and others around them. The most common lip pattern was long vertical.
