Japanese News – Di Collins

It's been a very busy and exciting few weeks in our Japanese classes.

The Foundation classes all watched on in awe as cocktail frankfurts were immersed in boiling water and then magically turned into octopus! In Japan tako weiner (octopus sausages) are a very popular lunchbox item with small children. The children have been learning numbers to 5 through a children's song which focusses on Japanese culture. 4 plus 4 gives 8, which is the number of legs that an octopus has, so this was a great opportunity to enjoy some tako weiner. They also enjoyed a Japanese folktale, The Monkey and the Crab, with Yui Sensei using an apron theatre to tell the story

Our Junior classes have been performing their play "The Giant Turnip" over the last couple of weeks. They were delighted with the impressive number of family members who came to watch them perform. The students were challenged to perform in front of an audience and to speak in Japanese, but they rose to the challenge and developed acting, speaking and Japanese language skills in the process. Well done

Two of our Senior classes made gyoza – Japanese dumplings - in our annual cooking session. They were challenged to make the pleats with the pastry, which are the signature mark of gyoza and many took up the challenge to produce some great looking gyoza!

cooking for their family and sharing skills, such as origami, with children.

Our Pre-Foundation room has an open learning space similar to kindergarten experiences, as well as a more typical classroom environment, where we develop learning stamina over the course of the year.

Highly skilled professionals are involved in your child's Pre-Foundation year, with regular communication between home and school encouraged.
