**Tour of Gippsland Cycling Event
Parking Disruptions Around School
Friday October 20**

On **Friday October 20**, the Tour of Gippsland road cycling event will be conducting a criterium circuit bike race around our school.

To ensure the safety of riders and the community, temporary changes to traffic conditions around Sale Primary School will be implemented. The following restrictions around our school will be in place:

The following roads will be closed on **Friday October 20** from **8.30am until 3.30pm** to allow for the set up and pack down of the event:

- Cunninghame Street – between Market and Marley Streets

The following roads will be closed on Friday October 20 from **10am until 2.30pm** for the event:

- Cunninghame Street – between Barkly and Marley Streets
- Marley Street – between Cunninghame and Macalister Streets
- Macalister Street – between Marley and Barkly Streets,
- Barkly Street – between Cunninghame and Macalister Streets, and
- Dundas Street, between Cunninghame and Macalister Streets

There will also be temporary restrictions to car parking along these sections of the road (the course). Temporary NO PARKING signs will be placed along the course; please obey these signs and ensure there are no parked cars on these roads during the above times. Racing begins at 11am for the women's racing and 12.30pm for the men's racing.

The community is invited to attend to come along and support Australia's best up and coming cyclists.
