### Swimming Carnival Friday February 14, 2025

Our 545 Grade 3-6 Swimming Carnival in 2025 will be held on Friday February 14, 2025.

The format will be a little different to past years due to the availability of the pool (Aqua Energy upgrade works). As such, we are not able to hold swimming trials prior to the Carnival on February 14.

Information will come home in the first week of term asking parents of students in Grades 3-6 to complete a form regarding their child's swimming ability.

We would also ask that parents/guardians please consider offering to volunteer to help on the carnival day. Roles include; starter, starting marshalls, finishing marshalls, timers and recorders. Your help at this event will be greatly appreciated and is essential to enable the Carnival to go ahead.

# Uniform Needs - Footwear/Socks/Hats

Our uniform is available for purchase from JSM Embroidery, Workwear and Safety, Macarthur Street, Sale. Pre-loved uniform is available from the school (please contact office staff for details).

**Footwear** - Usually in January, parents consider footwear for their children for the following school year. If your child prefers to wear runners – could you please ensure that they are predominantly black in colour (with no bright coloured stripes or trims), otherwise they will be expected to wear black school shoes – as indicated in the school's uniform guidelines. Students are also expected to wear white or grey school socks that cover the ankles. Ankle socks, which often cannot be seen, are NOT part of the 545 uniform.

**Hats** – Students will be required to wear their 545 hats when they return in Term 1, in line with our Uniform Guidelines. Students without their 545 hat will be required to play under the blue shade sails.

#### **2025** Grade 6 top

Grade 6 students will once again have the opportunity to purchase a 2025 Grade 6 top, if they wish to do so.

It is not compulsory for students to have, or to wear the top, but it is generally viewed as a memento of being in Grade 6

Students will be able to choose from either a long sleeved polo, a short sleeved polo or both. The cost of the tops is \$36 for the short sleeved polo and \$38 for the long sleeved polo.

Parents are asked to go to our uniform supplier, JSM in Macarthur Street Sale to pay for and place their order. Orders will close on Thursday January 30, 2025 – this is a one off production run and there will be NO opportunity for late orders.

#### 2025 Foundation Student Hat

Every year our Parents & Friends Association gift each new Foundation student a school hat at the start of the school year. I'm sure all of the families of our new Foundation students will join me in thanking our amazing Parents & Friends for this kind gesture.
