DISABILITY INCLUSION (DI) ROLLOUT AT 545 EWEN JONDAHL, ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Throughout the year, especially this semester, Sale Primary School staff have been working with me in preparation of the new disability support model for students.

Disability Inclusion will help our school better understand what our students need to help them learn and participate at school. It involves:

- a new Disability Inclusion Profile and school funding model to strengthen support for students with disability
- more resources, training and coaching for our teachers and school staff about the best ways to support students with disability.

In 2025, the **Disability Inclusion Profile** will be available to help us identify the strengths, needs, and educational adjustments we can make to assist students with disability and additional learning needs.

The Disability Inclusion Profile replaces the Program for Students with Disabilities (PSD) application process.

Over the coming years, we will invite families of students who are currently part of the PSD, and other students with disability and additional learning needs, to participate in a meeting to complete a Disability Inclusion Profile.

We will use **new school funding and supports** for more training and professional development for teachers and school staff, expert advice about disability, teachers and other staff to help plan and deliver changes for students, and resources to support learning.

The new Disability Inclusion approach ensures our school is better able to support students with disability and additional learning needs.

Sale Primary School is excited to be part of Disability Inclusion and we look forward to continuing to support our students to learn and thrive.

From Tuesday 26 November 2024, you will receive an email from the Department of Education with your unique \$400 School Saving Bonus code.

The School Saving Bonus will help families cover the cost of uniforms, textbooks, excursions, activities and more.

If you have multiple children enrolled in Victorian government schools for 2025, you will receive one School Saving Bonus code email per child. These emails might arrive on different days. Please make sure to check your spam/junk email folder.

Parents and carers can use the School Saving Bonus code in store at school-nominated suppliers.

Parents and carers can also choose to access the School Saving Bonus online system, where they can allocate part or all the \$400 bonus to use at school nominated-online suppliers or for school activities.



There will be a bbq (4.30pm) and raffle held on the night.



It was an unforgettable day that brought fun and valuable life lessons to our students.














ART ROOM NEWS LOU COOPER ART TEACHER

FOOD SAFETY SUPERVISOR CANTEEN


We are seeking a volunteer to be our nominated Food Safety Supervisor.


This nominated Food Safety Supervisor (FSS) will have the ability and authority to supervise other people to handle food at Sale Primary School.

This is part of our compliance requirement with the Wellington Shire so that the canteen can be used for Breakfast Club, TheirCare, storing of foods for our BBQ's etc.





Pertussis (Whooping Cough) Frequently Asked Questions

(Primary School and Children's Services)

WHAT IS WHOOPING COUGH?

Whooping cough is a highly contagious respiratory disease caused by the bacteria Bordetella pertussis. It is characterised by severe coughing fits that produce a "whooping" sound.

HOW IS IT SPREAD?

Whooping cough spreads through droplets from coughing or sneezing from an infected person. It can also spread by coming into contact with surfaces contaminated with these droplets.

WHY SHOULD I BE WORRIED?

Pertussis can affect people of all ages. However, young infants (especially those less than 6 months of age) are at increased risk of severe complications, including pneumonia, seizures, and even death. Being highly contagious, schools or groups of young children, who often cough & sneeze, can facilitate mass outbreaks – impacting children, and their direct and indirect contacts.

WHAT CAN I DO ABOUT IT?

Vaccination is the most effective prevention method.

Free pertussis-containing vaccination is available for eligible people through the <u>National Immunisation</u>

<u>Program</u> schedule, which include:

- · infants at 2 (can be given from 6 weeks of age), 4 and 6 months of age
- children at 18 months and 4 years of age
- adolescents in Year 7 (or age equivalent)
- pregnant women in every pregnancy between 20 to 32 weeks gestation
- people under 20 years who did not receive pertussis-containing vaccination in childhood, where the vaccine
 was not given during childhood as <u>catch-up vaccination</u>
- refugees and humanitarian entrants aged 20 and over.

An adult pertussis-containing vaccine is also recommended for the following people if their last dose was more than 10 years ago:

- adults working with or caring for children, especially healthcare and childcare workers in contact with infants
- women who recently gave birth and did not receive a pertussis-containing vaccine during pregnancy
- parents, guardians, or carers of infants aged less than 6 months
- adults 65 years of age and older as a single booster
- travellers.

Practising good hygiene and appropriate isolation measures from infected individuals also helps teduce the risk.

WHAT IF A CHILD IS UNWELL?

Pertussis begins with symptoms similar to those of a cold (e.g., cough, tiredness, blocked or runny nose, low-grade fevers which may last for one to two weeks), with the cough usually worsening to include:

- Severe bouts of coughing
- Characteristic 'whooping' sound on breathing
- Vomiting at the end of a bout of coughing

If your child becomes symptomatic, please visit your GP for testing and advice on antibiotic treatment.

For a listing of Priority Primary Care Clinics and telehealth services specifically for the Gippsland region, refer to the Gippsland Primary Health Network - After-hours Services.

CAN A CHILD GO TO SCHOOL/CHILDCARE?

For symptomatic children:

- Any symptomatic children must isolate and seek medical attention.
- Children diagnosed with whooping cough must <u>not</u> attend school for:
 - a. 21 days after the onset of cough, or
 - b. Until they have completed 5 days of a course of appropriate antibiotic treatment.

This exclusion is required by law under the Public Health and Wellbeing legislation.
